

## Know Your Rights

If approached in public by law enforcement or ICE

- You do have the right to remain silent and request legal representation (in the case of immigration question, the state is not required to provide a lawyer, but you may exercise your right to contact your own)
- Practice saying this out loud with family and friends AND print out Know Your Rights Cards to have on you to present if you're approached
- You do not have to sign anything you do not understand or do not agree to
- In Ohio, if law enforcement approaches you, you are required to verbally provide on request your name, date of birth, and address

Right to leave:

- If you are stopped by the police, ask loudly and clearly, "Am I being detained or am I free to leave?"
- If the officer says you are free to leave, stay calm and walk (do not run) away.
- You can ask if you are free to leave more than once during an encounter with the police. (For example, if you ask before the officer has asked the identity questions (name, DOB, address), you can ask again after providing that information.)
- If the officer says you are under arrest, you have the right to know why.
- If you are a bystander to an engagement, you are allowed to remind people of their right to remain silent and request legal representation and a written warrant.
- Practice saying these things out loud!

If ICE comes to your home

- You do not have to open the door
- Ask the officer to slide the warrant under the door or hold it up to a window
- Familiarize yourself with the possible warrants that might be presented to you
- Practice as a family reading the [Know Your Rights](#) card out loud, should an ICE or other law enforcement officer engage you
- If you do choose to speak to ICE or other law enforcement, tell the truth. Never show false documents.

An *administrative* warrant can be self-issued by an agency such as ICE; it allows law enforcement to detain a person in *public places*;

A *judicial* warrant is needed to enter *private spaces without invitation or permission*. A judicial warrant should have the name of the person being sought, the location in which the warrant is to be exercised, the date by which the warrant is to be exercised, and the signature of a judge or magistrate.

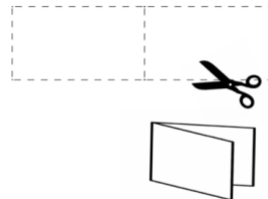
